## Upland girl takes home gold in national championship event

Several students from the Goltz Judo program in Claremont won awards at the USA Judo Junior Olympic National Championships in June in Anaheim.

They are JoJo Forman, 13, of Upland, who won a gold medal; Sadie Forman, 16, of Upland, and Kamdin Karmann, 18, of Riverside, silver; and Luke Yang, 8, of Claremont, bronze. Rachel Yang and Kiefer Allen, both of Claremont, were runners-up.

About 1,400 competitors from around the United States and from other countries attended the event.
